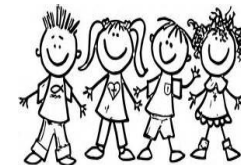

Collect

Creator God, you made us all in your image: may we discern you in all that we see, and serve you in all that we do; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Post Communion

God of our pilgrimage, you have led us to the living water: refresh and sustain us as we go forward on our journey, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord

1st Reading: Isaiah 44. 6-8

Thus says the LORD, the King of Israel and his Redeemer, the LORD of hosts: I am the first and I am the last; besides me there is no god.⁷ Who is like me? Let them proclaim it, let them declare and set it forth before me. Who has announced from of old the things

to come? Let them tell us what is yet to be.⁸ Do not fear, or be afraid; have I not told you from of old and declared it? You are my witnesses! Is there any god besides me? There is no other rock; I know not one.

Gospel: St Matthew 13. 24-30

Jesus put before them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field;²⁵ but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away.²⁶ So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well.²⁷ And the slaves of the

householder came and said to him, "Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?"²⁸ He answered, "An enemy has done this." The slaves said to him, "Then do you want us to go and gather them?"²⁹ But he replied, "No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them.³⁰ Let both of them

grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first

and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.' '
