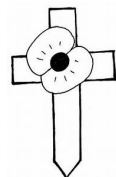

1st Reading: : Isaiah 51. 1-6

Health and Safety in St Andrews Church

Although there are many opinions about H&S, we are obliged by legislation to apply this act in church. So, as newly appointed H&S officer, here are a few observations-

- A. Overall responsibility for health and safety is that of the PCC, but all members of the congregation have a responsibility to co-operate in its implementation & to take reasonable care of themselves & others whilst on church business or in the premises.
- B. It is important to comply with any safety rules, operating instructions & working procedures.
- C. To use protective clothing and equipment when it is required.
- D. Report to myself or any member of the PCC, any defect or damage you might see in the church, hall and churchyard, that could cause injury,
