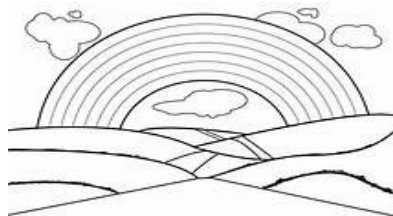
Post Communion

1st Reading: Genesis 9. 8-17

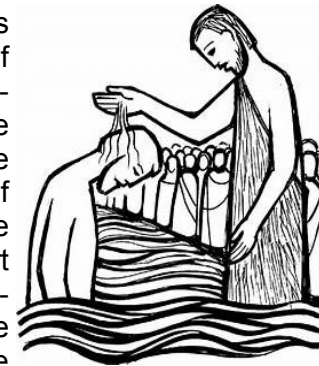
