Collect

Lord of all creation, your glory shines out in everything that you have made. Open our eyes to see your wonders and fill our hearts with your peace, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Post Communion

Father of all, you have taught us through your son Jesus Christ that love is the fulfilling of your law: teach us to love you with our whole heart and our neighbour as ourselves; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

1st Reading: James 3. 5-12

My brothers and sisters, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. ⁶ The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole body, sets the whole course of one's life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell. ⁷ All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and sea creatures are being tamed and have been tamed by mankind, ⁸ but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a rest-

less evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹ With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made in God's likeness. ¹⁰ Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be. ¹¹ Can both fresh water and salt water flow from the same spring? ¹² My brothers and sisters, can a fig tree bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Neither can a salt spring produce fresh water.
