Collect

God, our light and our salvation: illuminate our lives, that we may see your goodness in the land of the living, and looking on your beauty may be changed into the likeness of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Post Communion

God our Father, whose Son, the light unfailing, has come from heaven to deliver the world from the darkness of ignorance: let these holy mysteries open the eyes of our understanding that we may know the way of life, and walk in it without stumbling; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

1st Reading: Hebrews 1. 1-4

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets,² but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds.³ He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact

imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,⁴ having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

GOSPEL: St Matthew 21. 28-32

A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, "Son, go and work in the vineyard today."²⁹ He answered, "I will not"; but later he changed his mind and went.³⁰ The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, "I go, sir"; but he did not go.³¹ Which of the two did the will of his father?' They said, 'The first.' Jesus said to



them, 'Truly I tell you, the tax-collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you.'³² For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him, but the tax-collectors and the prostitutes believed him; and even after you saw it, you did not change your minds and believe him.




AUTUMN FAYRE GRAND DRAW TICKETS
