

## 11th November: Remembrance Sunday (3rd Sunday before Advent) (Year B)

### Collect

God, our refuge and strength, bring near the day when wars shall cease and poverty and pain shall end, that earth may know the peace of heaven through Jesus Christ our Lord.

### 1st Reading: Micah 4. 1-5

In days to come the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised up above the hills. Peoples shall stream to it,<sup>2</sup> and many nations shall come and say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths. 'For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.<sup>3</sup> He shall judge between many peoples, and

### GOSPEL: St John 15. 9-17

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love.<sup>10</sup> If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.<sup>11</sup> I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.<sup>12</sup> 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.<sup>13</sup> No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.<sup>14</sup> You are my friends if you do what I command


