

2024 Revision of the Church Electoral Roll

The Electoral Roll is a church's register of electors, it is a list of those qualified to vote at the Annual Parish Church Meeting where elections for the PCC and the Deanery Synod take place. Those entitled to have their names on this roll have to be 16 years of age or more and they must reside in the relevant parish or be regular worshippers in church whose roll they wish to join.

You can check if your name is already on the Electoral Roll: A Copy will be available at the back of church together with enrolment forms. Copy of the New Roll was created in 2019 and will be in place UNTIL 2025 and it is revised on an annual basis. If your name was entered on the Electoral Roll in 2019 or you joined in subsequent years, then you DO NOT need to fill out another application form.

Revision of the Roll commences on 31st March 2024 and application forms (available at the back of church) to be on the Electoral Roll must be returned to me by Sunday 14th April. Please note that this return date is final and non-negotiable because the Roll has to be completed not less than 15 days before the Annual Parish Meeting which is on Tues 30th April 2024.

Forms cannot be accepted after the return date until the end of the Annual Parish Meeting so, if you wish to vote in any of the elections or to stand for church office or election to the Parochial Church Council, I need to receive your form by 14th April 2024!

30th ANNIVERSARY OF ST ANDREW'S COFFEE SHOP

The coffee shop was opened on Wednesday 9th February 1994 and it's aim was to encourage the local community to come in and enjoy coffee and home made cakes in a lovely venue and a chance to talk privately if desired.

In the beginning a small team was organised by the then curate, Sharron, among them were Liz Fox, Barbara Neate, Margaret Walton, Jenny Endacott, Maureen Ragbourne and Tricia Dixon who came every week.

As the coffee shop became more popular four teams were formed and from this the coffee shop developed as we know it today. As team leaders retired new ones came in and has continued in this way over the years. Alongside coffee shop the W.I. ran a Homemades stall and Vineyard sold a variety of cards.

After continuing for 20 years it had opened a thousand times and raised £95,000 for church funds. To celebrate this milestone an all day coffee shop was held in the church, although it rained heavily all day it was a very special and enjoyable event.

From the funds raised we have been able to purchase new ropes for the bell tower, updating the sound system, materials to make the ordinary times banners, alter clothes and a cope and stole for the vicar to wear on special occasions.

Although funds raised now go to the general church fund our contribution is in the region of £10.000 annually.

We have successfully organised all day coffee shops for the folk festivals which have been much appreciated by all who supported it year after year. In 2012 a new servery and toilet facility was built in the church thanks to an anonymous donation which has proved a huge asset to the many events staged in the church not only by St Andrews but many choirs, orchestras, school concerts etc.

Our thanks must go to Caroline, Mary, Sheila and Wendy who took over the rains when Liz Fox stepped down as co-ordinator after 22 years of dedication and commitment to coffee shop. Also to Sheila and Chris Lawrence for hosting an annual shared lunch for us all in their beautiful home and garden over many years.

We have had many helpers and bakers over the last 30 years and it is wonderful that the dedicated teams we have now, with waitress service, using the nave of the church we can continue the tradition of providing a welcoming and popular place for our loyal customers to enjoy for many years to come.



Mothers' Union Update

We followed the AGM with a discussion on the period of lent looking at aspects of reflection, repentance, and preparation for Easter.

The Gympanzees Founder set out to provide quality, stimulating and sensory play experiences not only for these children but also for their siblings. Play experiences cover a range of ages and I was very moved to witness the joy that this initiative brings to these families.

The Gympanzees Charity have a huge vision, and have recently purchased a building, which, with extensive refurbishment and repurposing is planned to be a permanent home for all year-round play, fun, fitness, and friendships. 
Nigel Linacre says:

"I have a deep appreciation to St. Andrew's that we could record our album in the Church. Grief is a thing which will at some point come to all of us in challenging ways; my hope is that the opera will help people develop their relationship to grief so that it is less unendurable. I hope the opera helps us face the hardest thing in life which is death – and especially the death of somebody close to us and especially in such a horrible way.

Out of the loss came the Grief Opera. There is nothing like it in the world."

"Life is something which is beautiful, fantastic and lets us do great things. This remains the case, but I now also see that life can also be extremely difficult and filled with pain. When life is like that, we still have to be with it. We do not have to love suffering, but have love for the suffering, because love transforms everything it touches, including suffering.

Love is not owned by anyone or anything. It simply is. To me, this is consistent with the Biblical message of love as God. For what is God without love?"



My dear Nephew Darren,

So it was with the recent wedding in your church, where you allowed the happy but quite mad young couple to try and imitate the marriage of the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge. It was kind of them to want to celebrate Will and Kate's recent 10th wedding anniversary, but it did not seem to occur to anybody that your church, converted from a 1960s warehouse, is fractionally less impressive than Westminster Abbey. It was a pity that the groom, unlike Prince William, had not thought to get to the church on time – or indeed, at all. It was fortunate that the bride's mother found him in that pub nearby, or really, we would have struggled to complete the wedding.

A Final Word

I always find Lent, Holy Week and Easter particularly good times of the liturgical year for Hymns, and have been enjoying singing several of my favourites this past month. In particular, the hymn "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" sent shivers down my spine and tears in my eyes when I sung it a couple of Sundays ago. When I got home I read the words again and took a few minutes to really internalise and understand them. In doing so, I found them particularly moving in how we are invited to contemplate the sheer scale and significance of Christ's death and our response to it.

It might seem obvious, but it is important to remember that the Hymns we sing were written by a living person – likely a man or woman of profound faith – who was moved enough by their faith to write the words as a means to express their faith and worship God. Thinking about Hymns in this way gives me a new perspective and helps bring them to life a bit more, and reflect of my own lived experience of faith and worship of God in Church. I urge you to look up the words of your favourite Hymn and enjoy spending a few minutes reacquainting yourself with the words and their meaning. *Remy Osman, Editor*
