SUNDAY 4th AUGUST 2024: TRINITY 10 (LAMMAS)

Lammas (from Old English *hlāfmæsse*, "loaf-mass") is a Christian holiday celebrated on or near the 1st August. It is a festival marking the blessing of the First Fruits of harvest, with a loaf of bread being brought to the church for this purpose. Lammastide falls at the halfway point between the summer solstice and the autumn equinox and was probably the day when loaves baked from the first of the wheat harvest were blessed at church. Sometimes the Lammas loaf is broken into four parts, which are placed at the four corners of a barn, church or parish, for protection. Today we will bless and share a locally-baked loaf together and give thanks for the coming harvest that will sustain our community.

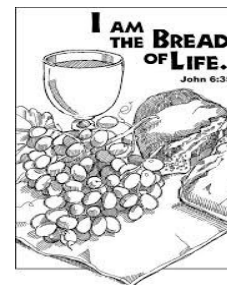
